

Standing surgical conjunctival squamous cell carcinoma in a horse

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Abstract A weight 430 kg, 3.5 years old, Chestnut Thoroughbred horse was presented with a mass 1 cm. in diameter at the conjunctiva of left eye. Clinical signs including eye discharge, conjunctivitis and photophobia had been noticed for 2 weeks. A surgical excision was performed to remove the mass under sedation. Histopathological examine of the mass revealed squamous cell carcinoma. The horse had clear cornea and was back to racing in 7 days after treatment.
