FIBROMAS IN GOLDFISH (*CARASSIUS AURATUS*): A CASE REPORT

Abstract A lion-head goldfish was 100 grams weight and 12.5 centimeters length. It was found to be five skin masses located adjacent to the left and dorsal side of the body about 1-1.5 centimeters in diameter. The masses had persisted for more than 3 weeks. A surgical excision was performed to remove the masses. Histopathological examination of the masses indicated that the tissues were fibromas. The fish had normal appetite, behavior and the wound healed in 1 month after the surgical treatment. **Chiang Mai Veterinary 2006;4(2):157-163.**
